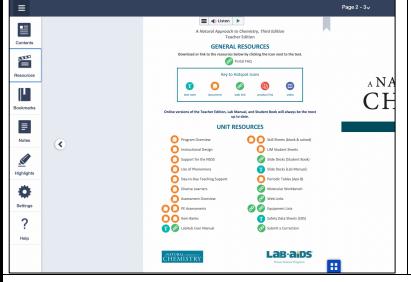

You can also get direct links on the left navigation under Resources.





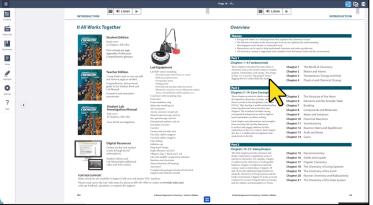




General Navigation:

Table of Contents: Use the *Table of Contents* to navigate to specific activities/sections and chapter supports

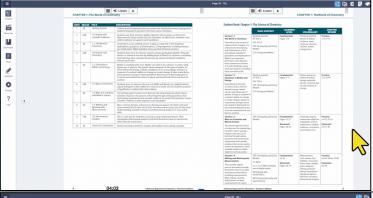
Use the **Introduction** to get a quick overview of the course to see how each component, Student Book, Laboratory Investigation Manual, Teacher's Edition and Equipment work together for the Chemistry course.



Course Overview:

Use the Overview to access the overall scope and sequence and the instructional design of the course.

Page view in the Teacher's Edition can be modified to a 1 page or 2 page view depending on viewing preferences.



Pacing Guide:

When you click on a specific Chapter it will take you directly to the chapter to access the chapter specific overview, connections to prior chapters and a 10- day pacing guide.

It will show you how the Student book and Laboratory Investigation Manual come together.



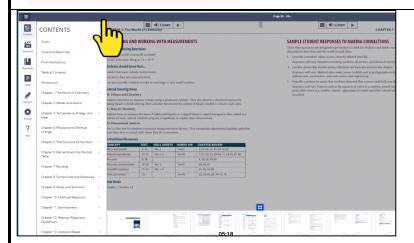
Navigating Within a Chapter:

- Detailed instructions for teaching the activities

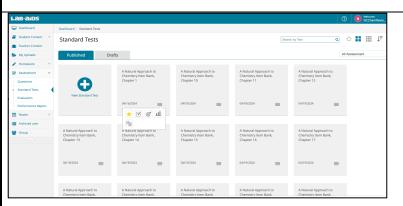






Navigation features through the portal include:

Assessments:

From the Teachers Edition to view

Assessments, click Back to Library to go to the main menu.

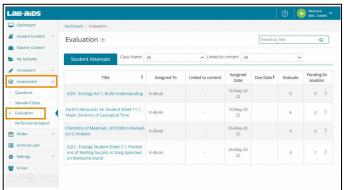
Assessment questions are available from the Table of Contents in the left-hand menu. Scroll down to Assessment and you will see Questions, Standard Tests, Evaluation and Performance Reports

Evaluating Student Responses when classes are loaded in the course:

From a teacher account, navigate to *Assessments* >> *Evaluation* from the left-hand menu.

The student questions will automatically appear in the *Evaluation* screen once the first student begins typing a response.

 To find a specific assessment more easily, teachers can use the search bar in the top right to type in search terms.



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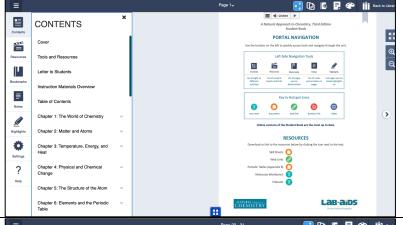
Accessing Student Books

To view student content, click Back to Library to go to the main menu

Click Student Content >> Content from the lefthand menu. This section displays titles that are available for both you and your students (Student Books, Lab Manual, and Simulation)



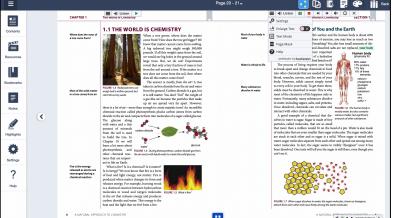




Navigating through Student Book:

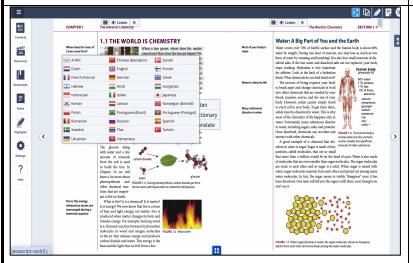
Navigating through the Student Book is similar to navigating through the Teacher's Edition.

- Use the Table of Contents to navigate through the chapters, activities, and sections.
- Next/Previous Buttons on the left and right side of the page



Navigation features through the student portal include:

- Blue thumbnail icon to show thumbnails of viewed pages
- "Page" option up top: Click on the existing page number and enter in the page number you'd like to navigate to directly.
- Left Menu: Contents: Click Contents to browse to a specific page or activity.

Translation:

ReadSpeaker can be used to have the text read to them. They can also highlight text to be read to them. Text can be translated in more than 29 different languages in a native speaker's voice.

Highlight a selection of text.

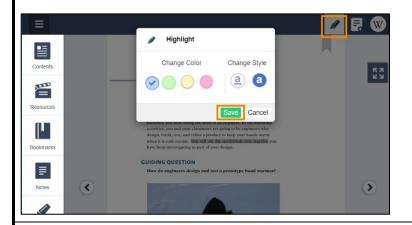
Click the *Translate* option that appears. Select language.

Customize audio and text settings by clicking the menu icons at the top of the translate popup:

 Play/Pause, Stop, Volume, Reading Speed, Decrease font size, Increase font size, Text settings (customize font size, font, text colors, and text spacing)





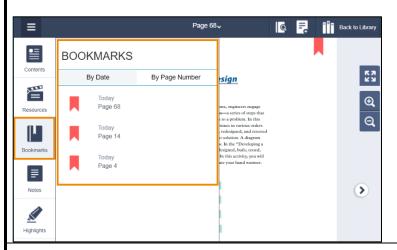


Highlight

Highlight text you wish to highlight. Then, the highlighter icon will appear in the top right of the page.

Click the highlight icon to choose a highlight color and save.

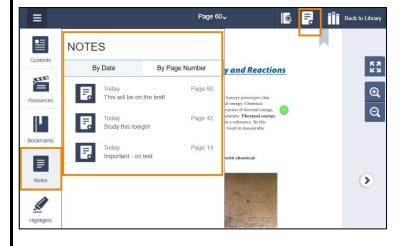
View all highlights by clicking on the "Highlights" option on the left menu bar. You can sort highlights by date entered or by page number.



Bookmark

From the page you wish to bookmark, click the "bookmark" icon in the top right of the page.

To view all bookmarks, click the "bookmarks" icon on the left side menu. You can sort bookmarks by date entered or by page number.



Notes

From any page in your book, click the "notes" icon on the top right of the page.

View all notes by clicking on the "Notes" icon on the left menu bar. You can sort notes by date entered or by page number.

Click anywhere on the page to add a note. Enter the text of your note. Click "save".
